Information on Scholarship Call 2024/25 (closing date 1st March 2024)

<u>ASEA-UNINET</u> supports the exchange of knowledge between partner universities and member countries in Europe and South-East Asia. In this context, the network supports the exchange of scientists and postgraduates and the transfer of knowledge associated.

The <u>Ernst Mach Grant – ASEA-UNINET</u> offers scholarships for full PhD studies, postdoc research stays and for studies in the field of music practice at an <u>ASEA-UNINET member university* in Austria</u> to students and researchers **from Indonesia, Malaysia, the Philippines, Thailand and Vietnam**.

Country of Origin: Indonesia, Malaysia, the Philippines, Thailand, or Vietnam (only applicants who hold the citizenship of one of these countries are eligible to apply)

Target Country: Austria

Area of Study: All fields of study: Natural Sciences, Technical Sciences, Human Medicine, Health Sciences, Agricultural Sciences, Social Sciences, Humanities

Types of Grants:

Full PhD Grant

- Target Group: Postgraduates who want to carry out a full doctorate/PhD-programme in Austria and fulfill the requirements for admission and who have completed their studies at a university outside Austria
 Duration: 36 months
- **Grant benefit:** EUR 1,250.-- per month + a travel costs subsidy of max. EUR 1,000.-- + a mobility subsidy of EUR 300.-- per month

Postdoc Grant

- Target Group:Postdocs who are involved in teaching and research at an ASEA-UNINET member
university* in Indonesia, Malaysia, the Philippines, Thailand, or VietnamDuration:3 to 9 months
- Grant benefit: EUR 1,250.-- per month + a travel costs subsidy of max. EUR 1,000.--

Music Practice Grant

Target Group: Undergraduates (or higher) in the field of music practice (instrumental and vocal performance, composition, and conducting)Duration: 9 months

Grant benefit: EUR 1,250.-- per month + a travel costs subsidy of max. EUR 1,000.--

*Incl. <u>ASEA-UNINET candidate members</u>

Maximum Age: Undergraduates, Graduates and Postgraduates: 35 years; Postdocs: 45 years.

Funding Organisation: OeAD-GmbH in cooperation with ASEA-UNINET (on behalf of and financed by the Austrian Federal Ministry of Education, Science and Research - BMBWF).

Language Proficiency: Very good knowledge of English and/or German.

Selection Process: After an examination of the formal requirements and an evaluation of the applications by experts, the candidates will be invited to a personal (face-to-face) interview. Applicants for the Music Practice Grant have to participate in an audition process including a mandatory interview (for further information see <u>here</u>). Final decision by the BMBWF.

Closing date for applications: 1st March 2024 (15th December 2023 for Music Practice)

- Written consent of the supervisor at the Austrian host university (in the field of music: "Letter of Endorsement" issued by the Austrian music universities after successful participation in the auditions)
- Two Letters of Recommendation by university lecturers
- Copy of passport
- University graduation certificates as well as an English or German translation.
