# About the Panelists



#### Jesús Crespo Cuaresma, WU Vienna

Jesús is Professor of Macroeconomics at WU Vienna, Research Scholar at the International Institute for Applied Systems Analysis (IIASA), and Research Associate at the Austrian Institute of Economic Research (WIFO). His research interests include applied econometrics, economic growth, human capital, and migration. His work—published in leading scientific journals—has provided new insights into the role of environmental shocks as drivers of human mobility, particularly forced migration.



### Jason Gagnon, OECD

Jason is the Head of the Migration and Skills Unit at the OECD and specializes in the relationship between migration and development in countries of origin, with a focus on enhancing the positive impacts and minimizing negative effects through policy. Much of his work centers on South-South migration and the intersection of migration and financial sector development.



#### Aida Hajro, University of Leeds

Aida is a Professor of International Business at the University of Leeds and a Visiting Professor at the Institute for Human Resource Management at WU Vienna. Her research focuses on the intersection of organizations and migration. She is also the Founding Co-Director of Migration, Business & Society, a global research and policy initiative dedicated to advancing migration-related targets within the sustainable development agenda.



#### Judith Kohlenberger, WU Vienna

Judith heads the Research Institute for Migration and Refugee Research and Management at WU Vienna and is Senior Researcher at the Austrian Institute for International Affairs (oiip) and Affiliate Policy Fellow at the Jacques Delors Centre, Hertie School Berlin. She is a member of the Integration Council of the City of Vienna, co-editor of German Journal of Forced Migration and Refugee Studies and author of several books, most recently *Migration Panic* (2025).



## Milda Žilinskaitė, WU Vienna

Milda is a Senior Scientist and Director at WU's Competence Center for Sustainability Transformation and Responsibility, and, together with Aida Hajro, a Founding Co-Director of the Migration, Business & Society initiative.
