

### Overview of 2020-2023: Events

All STaR events are related to encouraging research on and fostering awareness of the Sustainable Development Goals of the UN 2030 Agenda. They vary in format (in-person, hybrid, virtual) and size (from specialized expert workshops of 10-15 invitees to broader public events with 100-300 attendees).

#### IN EACH INDIVIDUAL YEAR FROM 2020 TO 2023, WE (CO)HOSTED AT LEAST:

- One academic conference or workshop
- One WU Matters WU Talks event
- · One smaller, thematically focused public dissemination event in collaboration with external partners
- · One student-engagement event

We actively engage STaR Faculty Members, WU staff, and distinguished alumni as speakers.

### Overview of 2020-2023: STaR SDG-Hub

One of our major undertakings during 2020-2023 was the establishment of <u>STaR SDG-Hub</u>. Our initial idea was to create a first of its kind resource bank for SDG-related research and teaching at WU. However, as we proceeded with the project, it expanded to a much larger knowledge dissemination endeavor.

After three years in the making, the STaR SDG-Hub resulted in five separate components: <u>STaR SDG Videos</u>, <u>STaR Humanitarian Aid</u>, <u>Impact Podcast</u> series, <u>STaR intro to ESGs</u>, and <u>STaR Resource Library</u>.

- A conversation between WU student volunteers from a range of bachelor's and master's programs
- STaR interview with a WU researcher, including STaR Faculty Members, postdoctoral, and PhD researchers
- STaR interview with an expert from the business world or civil society, including seasoned business executives, founders of sustainabilityfocused start-ups (especially, WU alumni), and leaders from nonprofit organizations based in Vienna

## Overview of 2020-2023: STaR Humanitarian Aid

## Supporting WU's wider humanitarian relief efforts is inseparable from our role as a responsibility-oriented center.

- In 2022, we mobilized a group of 20 student volunteers to produce a trilingual "Welcome to Vienna" brochure with useful information for asylum seekers in Vienna. In addition, our team compiled a carefully curated Google spreadsheet with links to volunteering and donations locally, information platforms, tools for learning German, and job search platforms for refugees.
- Also in 2022, we initiated a six-month research project that resulted in a publication of an employer guide, in collaboration with Austrian Economic Chamber (WKO) and Federation of Austrian Industries (IV) (authors: Judith Kohlenberger, Milda Žilinskaitė, Teresa Riosa). It presents research insights into refugee employment, dispels common misconceptions,

- and provides useful tips for recruitment, onboarding, and management of persons with refugee backgrounds. The official launch took place in summer 2023, at the ÖBB.
- Another major undertaking during 2022-2023 was ViaGerman program, led by WU alumnus Lukas Pichler together with STaR. Over the two years, its efforts added up to more than 600 hours of free German language lessons for more than 150 Ukrainian children taught by more than 40 volunteers, including, but not limited to, WU students, staff, and alumni. These efforts were formally recognized by the WU Rectorate, with appreciation certificates. In addition, in 2022, the initiative was nominated for The Global Business School Network's, of which WU is a member, impact award.









## Overview of 2020-2023: *RCE-Vienna Third Mission projects*

The Regional Centre of Expertise on Education for Sustainable Development Vienna (RCE Vienna) is a project-based, mostly externally-sponsored, network for research, education, and knowledge interactions on questions related to regional and transregional sustainable development and socioecological transformations. The RCE Vienna was founded by STaR's Christian Rammel and is one of more than 190 RCEs worldwide.

RCE Vienna is specifically active in the area of the Third Mission.

## Overview of 2020-2023: Contributions to sustainability teaching

SDG4 – "Ensure inclusive and equitable quality education and promote lifelong learning opportunities for all"—is at the core of STaR's mission as a university-based Competence Center.

Below are some examples of our engagement in WU's sustainability curricula development & support:

- RCE Vienna runs <u>Sustainability Challenge</u> (SC):

   a unique, innovative, cross-disciplinary, and cross-institutional course dedicated to the objectives of sustainable development. The SC offers two tracks: Service Learning and Start-ups.
- We have been actively involved in knowledge and practice exchanges on sustainability-teaching through the global

#### **Network for Business Sustainability**

(NBS) community (200+ business school sustainability centers from around the world); also by serving on the NBS Advisory Board (Milda Zilinskaite).

- We have been closely collaborating with WU's <u>Executive Academy</u>, supporting them in the development and implementation of several sustainability-oriented curricula initiatives.
- We have worked with WU's Program
  Management and Teaching & Learning
  Support team and the external institutional
  partners from the ENGAGE.EU network,
  with Günter Stahl leading the faculty
  development group of the General
  Sustainability Management Program.

## Overview of 2020-2023: Student engagement and support

Our <u>For Students</u> site, created in 2021 and regularly updated ever since, comprises:

- Dedicated to sustainability-oriented <u>Student Organizations</u> with whom we collaborate on regular basis. Notable examples are Oikos Vienna and Thinkubator
- A page titled <u>Studying Sustainability</u> that provides an overview of courses on sustainability offered at WU and links to the Zukunftsfähiges Wirtschaften (ZuWi) program.
- BA/MA Thesis: Writing for Impact. This unique site guides students who want to write their theses on sustainability issues. Since 2020, we have provided an annually updated list of more than 170 Faculty Members from over 50 WU Institutes, focusing on their theses supervision areas. In addition, we have been conducting and posting on our communication channels interviews with students who have successfully completed their theses on sustainable development topics. This promotes the efforts of both students and their supervisors.





Future Directions (2024–2027) Over the next three years, we will continue serving as a platform for networking, knowledge exchange, curricula development, and outreach. We are planning our specific activities along these • two pathways

Fostering the reputation and relationships we have already established by maintaining our core activities at the highest quality level

Initiating new long-term projects that engage new stakeholders in Austria and internationally

Our view is that sustaining our core strengths is just as important as breaking new ground.

### FOSTERING ESTABLISHED REPUTATION AND RELATIONSHIPS

- Supporting STaR Faculty Members and other WU faculty (including mid- and early-career researchers) who work on sustainability related topics
- Connecting these faculty to potential theses supervisees and to external stakeholders looking for expert speakers and academic collaborators
- Collaborating with other organizational units at WU: Executive Academy, International Office, Program Management and Teaching & Learning Support, Innovation Office, Environmental Management (Green Buddies), Volunteering@WU, ZuWi, and other Competence Centers
- Liaising with student organizations and responding to individual student/alumni inquiries
- Representing WU at Austrian (Allianz, CCCA), European (Copernicus), and global (NBS, PRME) sustainability networks
- Assisting WU in its reporting and accreditation efforts (AACSB, EQUIS, and AMBA)

## INITIATING NEW LONG-TERM PROJECTS

- Engaging in new sustainability-oriented curriculum and content development
- Expanding external STaR stakeholder network: seeking out additional contacts and collaboration opportunities within UNIDO, the Ban Ki-moon Center for Global Citizens, the International Anti-Corruption Academy, the Federal Ministry Republic of Austria Interior, Ashoka, IKEA Austria, ÖBB, World Data Lab, Ada, Institute for Human Rights and Business
- Working toward research-focused long-term collaboration with the World Bank (details currently under discussion with the WU's Rectorate)
- Developing, securing funding, and carrying out new Third Mission projects: UNcode Hackathon: AI Creativity for UNIDO Goals (funded by UNIDO), The Urban Shift (funded by Erasmus+), Green Leap (funded by Erasmus+), and more

- VISIBILITY: STaR is a highly visible Competence Center at and beyond WU. We have achieved this visibility by being strategic about identifying our key stakeholders, building long-term relationships with them, embracing new networking opportunities, and strategically engaging in online promotion. Our events and Third Mission projects target international audiences. Our academic collaborations—including those of the STaR core team and Faculty Members—reach all four corners of the Earth.
- EXCELLENCE: We strive for the highest standards of quality, precision, and attention to detail in all our activities, whether it be research, teaching and curricula development, or public outreach. We believe excellence is not about achieving outstanding results occasionally but rather about the discipline of maintaining high performance quality consistently over the years. For this reason, our team dedicates time

- and effort to continuous improvement through stakeholder interviews and feedback.
- SYNERGIES: We regularly partner up with individual faculty and different academic units at WU to enhance our reach. We strive to think not only outside the disciplinary boxes but also "outside the campus," seeking out and fostering partnerships with thought leaders and organizations outside of WU.
- THIRD MISSION: Third Mission is one of the core strengths and a distinguishing feature of STaR. Our team continuously engages with society in ways beyond traditional research and teaching activities. We have developed specific means of sharing knowledge, expertise, and resources with businesses, intergovernmental agencies, nonprofit organizations, and the public. We also regularly engage with local communities in and beyond Vienna.
