

IGN Research Workshop: The Dialectic of Emancipation. Transgressing Boundaries and the Boundaries of Transgression

Since the 19th-century, emancipation has been linked to progressive political agendas: the liberation from tradition and patronizing pre-givens. In recent years, however, emancipation and the progressive political meanings attached to it have come under significant pressure: ecologically and politically. From an ecological perspective, gains in (individual) autonomy and self-determination have always correlated with growth-based, resource-intensive forms of production and consumption that are known to be unsustainable by now. Politically, right-wing populists have appropriated the language of emancipation and changed its meaning by relating emancipation to the liberation from liberal democratic political elites, institutions, and universalist values. In this 2-day workshop, which serves the preparation of a Special Issue publication in the *European Journal of Social Theory*, we will discuss one of modern politics' key concepts, emancipation, against the backdrop of current societal challenges and changes.
