## RUSSELL HARPRING DELIVERING CASH AND VOUCHER ASSISTANCE IN HUMANITARIAN OPERATIONS – A SUPPLY CHAIN MANAGEMENT PERSPECTIVE:

Over the past decade, the use of cash and voucher assistance in the humanitarian sector has increased drastically. What was once a limited and seldom-used mechanism now accounts for over 20% of all international humanitarian assistance. This increase has created impacts on humanitarian supply chains and logistics activities. This discussion explores those impacts and addresses the risks, challenges, and benefits of using cash and voucher assistance in the humanitarian sector.

**Russell Harpring** is a PhD student at Hanken School of Economics in the department of Supply Chain Management and Social Responsibility. His research focuses on humanitarian logistics with a special interest in the use of cash and voucher assistance in complex emergencies, including how services are procured and implemented. He received his Master of Engineering in Industrial Engineering from the University of Louisville, with a thesis on the use of simulation techniques in the public sector to improve efficiency.
