BEE students, whose theses are to be written in English, are welcome to apply for supervision of their bachelor's theses dealing with any of the following topics:

- Standing (*locus standi*) of non-governmental organisations in the environmental case law of the ECtHR (*KlimaSeniorinnen, Cannavacciuolo and others*)
- The advisory opinion procedure before the ECtHR
- The European Union's competence to conclude the new agreement on the protection of biodiversity in the high seas (BBNJ Agreement)
- The European Union's emergency powers under Article 122(1) TFEU: Conditions for application and limits
- Fundamental change or business as usual? The enforceability of sustainability provisions using the example of the EU-New Zealand Free Trade Agreement
- Industrial Emissions Portal Regulation (EU) 2024/1244: Innovations and implications for Austria
- Ecological sustainability and the Austrian Monument Protection Act (Denkmalschutzgesetz)
- Everything new in the cumulative impact assessment in the EIA Act? Changes and open questions arising from the latest Supreme Administrative Court case law
- Access to justice for environmental organisations in the event of failure to carry out nature impact assessment
