Geopolitical Crises and International Tax Coordination

Over the last 15 years, the world has lived through numerous intensive shocks, such as the global financial crises, the Euro crisis, increased political polarization, the fracturing of global trade and supply chains, a global pandemic, an energy crisis, and a jump in inflation. In the past 2 years, the large-scale Russian war in Ukraine has put an end to the perceived military calmness, and military conflicts, coups, and tensions are blazing up in different parts of the world again. Until recently, international tax coordination still appeared like a tranquil island in this ocean of geopolitical crises, with the OECD Inclusive Framework seemingly uniting the vast majority of the global economy behind a remaking of the international tax order. Are these days numbered? Will the increased assertiveness of the UN reshuffle the power-dynamics of international taxation? Are we heading into a new crisis of international tax law? How will the world of international taxation look like? And what might be the role of the EU in a multipolar tax world? These and other questions will be addressed by distinguished scholars from around the globe during three panels in our 2nd WU Global Tax Seminar on "Geopolitical Crises and International Tax Coordination".
