The Competence Center <u>Insight Austria</u> combines research in behavioral economics with issues arising from various national policies. The new unit is led by the Director of the IHS, Martin Kocher. The open position complements the team of Insight Austria and involves contributing to empirical research in the policy areas of family and youth, health, and economics, among others. Establishing relations and deepening networks with related research institutions in Vienna and at the international level is also expected. The Institute will support efforts towards independent publications in academic journals.

- MA/MSc degree in economics or in behavioral science, with focus on behavioral economics (a PhD is not required, but would be considered regarding remuneration)

- Fluent in English and German (German as native language is an advantage)
- Skilled in econometrics, specifically with statistical software such as R or Stata
- Excellent interpersonal, written and oral skills
- Capable and willing to prepare and conduct empirical research projects

Desirable additional qualifications

- Good knowledge of institutional setting of Austria public administration and economic policies, or willingness to swiftly acquire this knowledge
- Passionate in communicating with decision makers in science, politics, business, and society

Our offer

You will collaborate in ongoing research projects and you will have the opportunity to initiate new projects to follow your own research interests. The IHS also offers excellent conditions for academic publishing and for scholarly exchange at the international level. You will be engaged in an intellectually challenging and exciting setting with a cooperative and international atmosphere, and flexible and family-friendly working hours. The Institute is ideally located in an old Palais in the eighth district of Vienna, with good access to public transportation.

The minimum salary offer for a full-time position is € 3,065.90 gross per month (14x), depending on job grading in accordance with IHS salary scheme and relevant work experience determining the assignment to the particular salary grade. The Institute values equal opportunities, with special emphasis on increasing the number of women in senior research positions, and specifically asks female candidates to apply for the open position. In case of equal qualification, female candidates will be preferred.
