







## MOBILITY SCHOLARSHIPS FOR DOCTORAL STUDENTS

WU would like to encourage its doctoral students' mobility by granting scholarships. An amount of up to  $\in$  2,000 per applicant may be granted to reimburse students for travel and accommodation expenses and conference fees. The funds are provided by the "Allgemeine Hochschulstipendienstiftung für Wiener Hochschulen" and the "Max und Marie Menger-Stiftung".

Mobility Scholarships are primarily intended to financially support stays abroad. From the academic year 2022/23 onwards, travels within Austria can be funded with up to  $\in$  1.000, per applicant as well.

## Mobility scholarships may be granted for the following purposes:

- Participation in a doctoral course of a(n) (accredited) university or scientific institution (e.g. EDAMBA), provided that your participation in the course is the reason for your trip.<sup>1</sup> (IMPORTANT: please inform yourself in advance whether the course can be accredited for your doctoral studies!)
- 2. Participation in a scientific conference connected with the topic of the dissertation, provided that you present a paper at the conference.
- 3. Academic research for the dissertation at a university or other (research) institution, if this university/institution personally invited you.
- 4. Research/data collection for the dissertation.

## **Requirements for application**

1. **Doctoral program in social and economic sciences** and **PhD Economics and Social Sciences**: Courses adding up to at least 30 ECTS, *Research Proposal* approved by the main supervisor

- 2. PhD Finance and DIBT: Courses adding up to at least 30 ECTS
- 3. **Doctoral program in business law 2009**: 3 of the 5 mandatory seminars (at least one of which has to be in the subject of the dissertation) and *Research Proposal* approved by the main supervisor

Please indicate if you intend to apply for other scholarships besides the mobility scholarship. The mobility scholarship may be used for covering the costs not covered by the other scholarship. The mobility scholarship can be granted to a doctoral student only **once** during their studies.

 $<sup>^{1}</sup>$  Doctoral students who for instance would like to attend a doctoral course at the University of Munich are not entitled to a mobility scholarship if they are working at Munich or if their parents live there.

## **Submission forms**

- 1. filled-in application form
- 2. consolidated grade record
- 3. Research Proposal and form "Approval of the Research Proposal" signed by the main supervisor
- 4. explanatory statement of the mobility project (two pages maximum)
- 5. short statement of the supervisor of the dissertation in support of your application
- 6. cost report, confirmation of booking/receipts

Applications can be submitted to the doctoral office anytime, either in advance of your stay abroad or after you have returned. The decision of conferral takes place in October. There is no legal entitlement to being granted a mobility scholarship. The granting of the mobility scholarship does not vindicate a claim of refund or remission of tuition fees.
