

MOBILITY SCHOLARSHIPS FOR DOCTORAL STUDENTS

WU would like to encourage its doctoral students' mobility by granting scholarships. An amount of up to € 2,000 per applicant may be granted to reimburse students for travel and accommodation expenses and conference fees.

Mobility scholarships may be granted for the following purposes:

1. Participation in a doctoral course of a(n) (accredited) foreign university or scientific institution (e.g. EDAMBA), provided that your participation in the course is the reason for your trip.¹ (**IMPORTANT: please inform yourself in advance whether the course can be accredited for your doctoral studies!**)
2. Participation in a scientific conference connected with the topic of the dissertation, provided that you present a paper at the conference.
3. Academic research for the dissertation at a foreign university or other (research) institution, if this university/institution personally invited you.
4. Research/data collection for the dissertation abroad.

Requirements for application

1. **Doctoral program in social and economic sciences 2007:** the following courses /exams must have been completed successfully: Philosophy of science, Research Methods I: Quantitative Paradigm, Research Methods II: Qualitative Paradigm, Research Seminars I and II; submitted *Research Proposal*
2. **PhD Economics and Social Sciences:** Courses adding up to at least 30 ECTS, submitted *Research Proposal*
3. **PhD Finance and DIBT:** Courses adding up to at least 30 ECTS
4. **Doctoral program in business law 2009:** 3 of the 5 mandatory seminars (at least one of which has to be in the subject of the dissertation) and submitted *Research Proposal*

Please indicate if you intend to apply for other scholarships besides the mobility scholarship. The mobility scholarship may be used for covering the costs not covered by the other scholarship. The mobility scholarship can be granted to a doctoral student only **once** during his/her studies.

¹ Doctoral students who for instance would like to attend a doctoral course at the University of Munich are not entitled to a mobility scholarship if they are working at Munich or if their parents live there.

Submission forms

1. filled-in application form
2. consolidated grade record
3. *Research Proposal* of the dissertation
4. explanatory statement of the mobility project (two pages maximum)
5. short statement of the supervisor of the dissertation in support of your application
6. cost report

Application can be submitted to the doctoral office anytime, either in advance of your stay abroad or after you have returned. The decision of conferral takes place in October. There is no legal entitlement to being granted a mobility scholarship. The granting of the mobility scholarship does not vindicate a claim of refund or remission of tuition fees.
