

## **Position Announcement:**

## Full Professor of Quantitative Social Research (Ref.no 2457-05) WU (Vienna University of Economics and Business)



WU (Vienna University of Economics and Business) is currently inviting applications for the position of a Full Professor<sup>1</sup> of Quantitative Social Research at the Department of Socioeconomics.

It offers a broad range of subjects in all areas of economics and business administration. Research and teaching at the Department of Socioeconomics integrates knowledge across disciplines to investigate the interplay of social and economic dynamics and to address social, economic, demographic and environmental challenges to sustainable development.

Required qualifications: Applicants should have: a) a solid academic qualification (e.g. PhD, habilitation degree) in Social Science, b) an outstanding international reputation in high quality scholarship in applied quantitative social research evidenced by publications in top-tier journals and presentations at top-tier conferences in the field; c) a strong record in attracting research funding for empirical research; d) demonstrated ability to organize and manage research; and e) social skills (e.g. the ability to work in teams).

The ideal candidate has a proven ability to work in an interdisciplinary environment and a background in socioeconomics. S/he applies quantitative methods to socioeconomic problems in areas linked to at least one of the core research areas of the Department (e.g. economic sociology; analysis of social structure, social and spatial disparities; sustainable socioeconomic systems; demography and population research; multilevel governance). The successful candidate should have a proven track record of excellent teaching in Quantitative Methods and is expected to teach courses at bachelor, master and PhD levels, especially in the two Masters Programs offered by the Department. Teaching experience in English is required; teaching experience in German is not necessary. Non-German-speaking candidates will be expected to acquire proficiency in German over a certain period of time. The new professor is expected to take an active role in the University's self-governance.
