

PhD Students - Doctoral Program in International Business Taxation (WU Vienna)

The **Doctoral Program in International Business Taxation (DIBT) at WU Vienna (Vienna University of Economics and Business)** invites applications from outstanding students in economics and related fields for its three-year, fully English-taught PhD program.

ABOUT DIBT

DIBT offers a three-year PhD program in economics with a strong interdisciplinary component. It includes rigorous training in theoretical and empirical research on taxation and public finance, complemented by insights from law and business with a focus on international taxation.

The first year provides intensive coursework in public finance, international taxation, and applied econometrics, followed by research seminars, workshops, and an international research stay. All courses are taught in English.

Students are free to choose their own dissertation topics within the broad field of international business taxation. As guidance, current research at DIBT includes projects on the environmental, social, and governance (ESG) dimensions of taxation—such as the design of carbon and biodiversity taxes, the incidence and distributional effects of corporate taxation, and the real and financial effects of anti-tax-avoidance measures and global minimum taxation. Much of the research at DIBT is empirical and based on high-quality microdata, but theoretical work is equally welcome.

APPLICATION

The program is open to applicants worldwide, holding a master's or equivalent degree in economics, law, or business. Candidates from other disciplines who have sufficient background in taxation are also welcome to apply.

FINANCIAL SUPPORT

Admission is highly selective, with limited spots available. Accepted students will benefit from tuition fee waivers and excellent research conditions. Additionally, a limited number of employment contracts will be available, offering a gross annual salary of approximately

€39,000 (14 x €2,786 per month before tax and social/medical deductions). WU Vienna always goes the extra mile to provide an ideal research environment.
