Transfer the following verbal description into an EPC:

- a) A planned order is either created automatically or manually. A combination of automatic and manual creation is also likely. The whole process is triggered only in the case that the conversion date is reached.
- b) Once this is achieved, the manufacturing department determines the planned order type.
- c) Thereafter the manufacturing department specifies the planned order position.
- d) Depending on the product category (in-house production / external procurement), the planned order is either to be converted into a production order, a purchase requisition or a process order.
- e) For a conversion into a production order, the manufacturing department needs to specify the production order type so that the conversion to a production order may be started.
- f) For a conversion into a purchase requisition, the purchasing department needs to specify the procurement type so that the conversion to a purchase requisition may be started.
- g) For a conversion into a production order, the manufacturing department needs to specify the process order type so that the conversion to a process order may be started.
