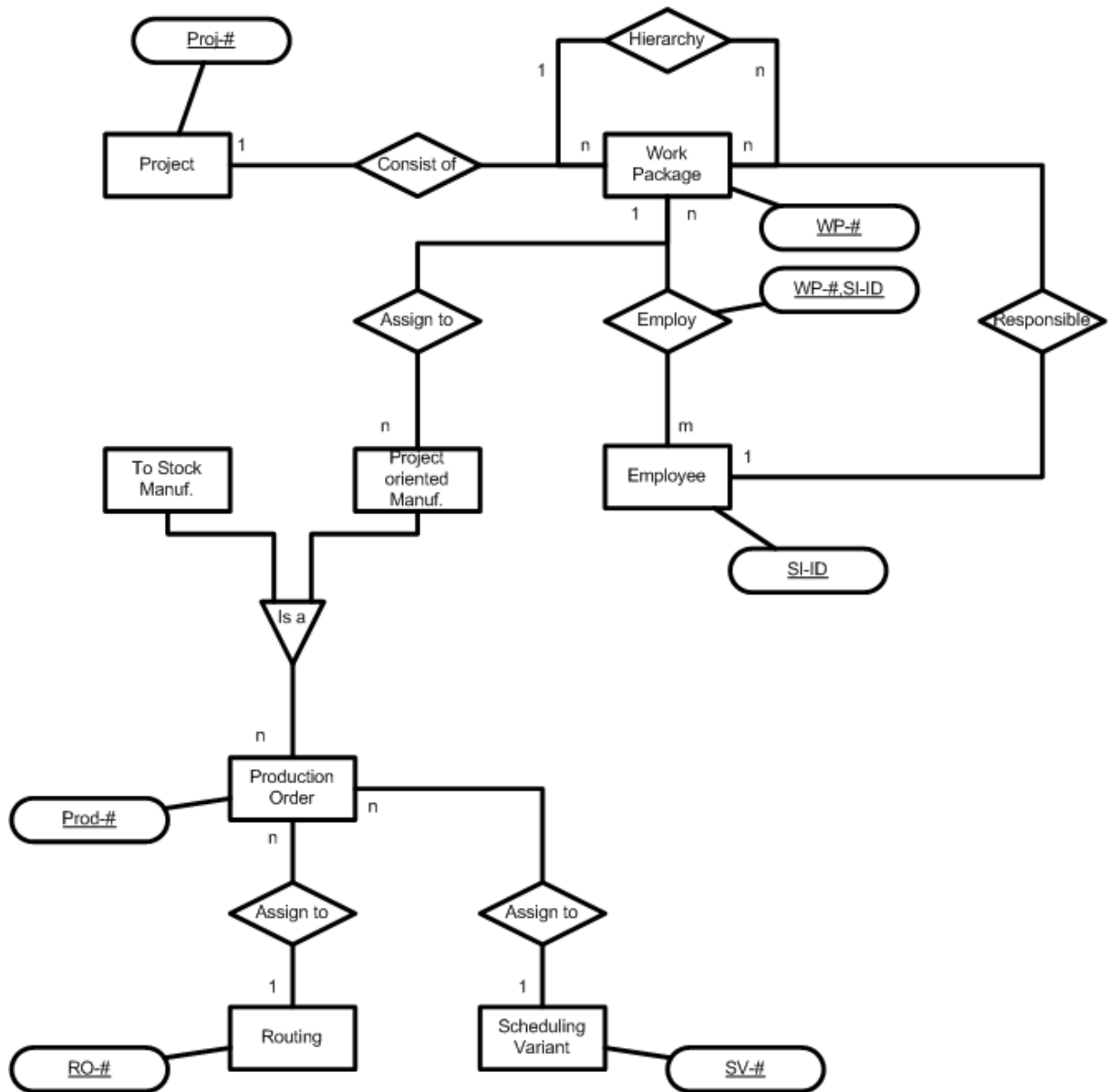


Project Management - Production Order

Transfer the following verbal description into an ERM:

- a) A project (Proj-#) consists of work packages (WP-#), which are connected to a hierarchical structure; each work package, except those of the highest hierarchy level is assigned to exactly one work package of the next higher hierarchy level.
- b) There are employees (SI-ID) who are active in work packages (possibly also several ones), a work package can also employ several employees. Each work package has exactly one responsible person; Employees can be responsible for several work packages.
- c) Production orders (Prod-#) can be classified as those generated by projects and those which are manufactured to stock. The former are assigned to exactly one work package; a work package can also activate several production orders.
- d) Each production order is assigned to exactly one routing (RO-#) and one scheduling variant (SV-#).
