




Numbers of applications (from 2010 until now)



- English Proficiency (e.g. IELTS, TOEFL)

English Requirements



The following certificates are accepted as **proof of proficiency in English**:

- TOEFL 100
- IELTS 7.0
- TOEIC 800
- Cambridge English: CAE (Certificate in Advanced English), CPE (Certificate of Proficiency in English), BEC Higher (Business English Certificate Higher)
- UNIcert III
- A full English-taught bachelor's program (at least 3 years) or master's program (at least 2 years); a
 confirmation from the university is required to prove that the program was taught in English. Please
 note that just an exchange semester or a year in an English speaking country or individual study
 courses taught in English is not sufficient.
- English as first language
- C1-level certificate issued by a university language center, according to the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages The certificate has to proof that you took one or more tests to assess your reading, writing, listening and speaking skills. These skills should correspond to level C1 or higher according to the CEFR.

If you took the English Business Communication (EBC) courses at WU, you still need to submit an English certification. The EBC (1-3) courses will NOT be accepted as proof of your language skills.

Fast Track



FAST TRACK ADMISSION for top-performing students



- Students with an excellent GPA
 - Required minimum scores: at least 90% of your university's GPA scale
 - Example: if max. GPA is 10, the required GPA is at least 9.
- Could receive an offer prior to the current priority deadline
- Provided that their complete application is submitted at least 3-4 weeks before the next priority deadline.
- Please note the priority deadlines for fast track admission.
