SIGMA GVC: DIGITAL TRANSFORMATION

Format of the SIGMA course:

- Attend the synchronous (Live) online Kick-Off and Closing webinars
- Complete the online self-learning modules
- Work in cross-institutional group work (groups of 4)
- Reflective exercise conducted in each university
- Possible additional tasks (communicated at your university)

Modules

The modules are hosted on WU's platform, the SIGMA portal.

As a WU student, you can log in with your Learn account (username: h1234567; Password: your WU password). SIGMA students from other universities have to register first. You will get an e-mail to confirm your registration. Finally, please agree to the terms of use. After you complete the registration, we will activate your account manually. You will see the modules only after your account has been activated, which takes only a few minutes during office hours. After a short time, please log in again with the account you registered on the platform to access the modules.

The passing score is 60%. Each quiz counts individually. You receive 4 points for each passed module and 0 points for each failed module. We can reset the results in exceptional cases, such as technical issues. Please send a screenshot for proof. It is not required to pass every module to pass the SIGMA course. The number of points you achieve in the online part of the course is added to your overall grade.

CaseCast

You are allocated in groups of four and work together with students from other universities. You can download the <u>document on the group composition</u> here. The task your group will be working on includes the analysis of a case study, which is presented in short form as a video (=CaseCast, instructions from the website <u>for the DT course</u>). The scope of the analysis is 12 slides or 4 pages excluding the list of sources, the video should not be longer than 2.5 minutes. Group work is supervised by the teachers and assessed by him or her using rubrics (<u>rubrics DT course</u>).

On November 30, upload both files, the analysis, and the video, to Taskcards. We will share the link to where to upload your CaseCast shortly before the deadline in November.
